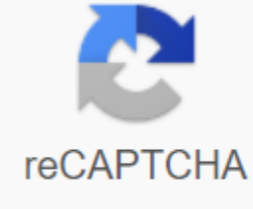




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emerging language over prepared materials and after an explicit curriculum. Thornbury has written more than a dozen books on ELT methodology. Two of them, Natural Grammar and Learning Off, received the British Council's ELTon Innovation Award, which was awarded the highest award in the industry (in 2004 and 2010, respectively). Thornbury is also the editor of a series of Cambridge guides for language teachers and the author of many scientific papers on language teaching. His blog A-I ELT is one of the most influential and visited blogs in the field of ELT. His approximately 15 textbooks for beginners and intermediate students have been published by major academic press, including Oxford University Press and Cambridge University Press, although his recent stance on Learning is Off - also the title of one of his methodological books - is often described as strongly anti-textbook. 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
