Joon believed that a number of mental processes constitute the psychological type of each person. He identified four key psychological functions: thinking, feeling, feeling and intuition. Each of these features is usually externally focused (extroverted) or internally focused (introverted). MBTI advocates often use what they call a functional stack when analyzing results.
